### Categories & Classes of Immigrants in Canada

1. Permanent Resident
  - (a) Economic Class (High-Skilled or Business Class)
    - (i) Investors
    - (ii) Entrepreneurs
    - (iii) Self-Employed
  - (b) Family Class (not assessed on point-system, but relationship to sponsor)
  - (c) Refugee Class & Asylum
  - (d) Humanitarian or Compassionate Grounds
2. Temporary or Guest Workers (Low-Skilled Temporary Foreign Worker Program)

### Point System Criteria

- ▶ Languages
- ▶ Experience
- ▶ Age
- ▶ Arranged Employment
- ▶ Adaptability (spouse's education, previous work experience, family relations in Canada)
